I wish to use this space to share a couple of thoughts he shared on various occasions that I found very interesting, diverse and timeless...

Stephen Hawking passed on...his legacy shines bright!!

#### **ON HIS SCHOOLING**

"At school, I was never more than about halfway up the class. It was a very bright class. My classwork was very untidy, and my handwriting was the despair of my teachers. But my classmates gave me the nickname Einstein, so presumably they saw signs of something better."

(From the lecture "My Brief History," 2010)

#### **ON DISABILITIES**

"If you are disabled, it is probably not your fault, but it is no good blaming the world or expecting it to take pity on



you. One has to have a positive attitude and must make the best of the situation that one finds oneself in; if one is physically disabled, one cannot afford to be psychologically disabled as well. My disabilities they have helped me in a way by shielding me from lecturing and administrative work that I would otherwise have been involved in... I find that people in general are very ready to help, but you should encourage them to feel that their efforts to aid you are worthwhile by doing as well as you possibly can."
