The 10th Annual STEM Fest (Open Day) was organized on Jan. 26, 2019, coinciding with the 70th Republic Day celebrations. The theme was "Think, Ink, Innovate". Mr Mahesh Jambardi, COO of Excel Soft Technologies Pvt. Ltd., inaugurated the Fest and urged students to think on how the Indian space program has emerged as one of the most powerful and promising research areas. Realms of Science

As a part of extended learning activity in biology, students of Class 9 visited the Botany, Zoology and Genetics laboratories in the University of Mysore on 17th January 2019, bridging the gap between classroom learning and real-world experiences. They observed more than two thousand animal and plant specimens. The opportunity to see the breeding house of Guinea Pigs which helps the post graduate students to study the effect of different chemicals on the animals was fascinating. The learners also visited the Genetics lab where research is conducted on the common fruit fly *Drosophila melanogaster*, which helps understand



genetics in a simpler way. The students noted the taxonomic details of the specimens preserved in the zoology lab. The lab technician at the Botany laboratory demonstrated the way in which the specimens were preserved by preparing a solution of formaldehyde. The walk through the botanical garden introduced students to the different medicinal plants grown there and their importance. This field trip helped the students appreciate the variety of life forms and their classification.

Special guests

Advocating Avidity

On 22nd December 2018, Mr. Azhar Meer, Advocate at Karnataka High Court and a specialist in dispute resolution, addressed the students of Class 11 on the importance of pursuing what they are passionate about. He emphasized that happiness and contentment is found only if the job they perform brings out the best in them. He threw light on the trials and

tribulations of his profession as a law practitioner and gave insights on how one could wade through the harsh realities possessing a strong conviction about the values that govern one's life. In a nutshell, the session was about the importance of nurturing values, having an unwavering conviction about them and exercising them to succeed in the chosen profession.

Building Blocks

On 28th December, 2018, Ms. Smriti Manoj, Managing Director of Overseas Business Operations, SETTY, and her team engaged the students of Class 11 about the various milestones involved in a construction project. Her team involved the heads of important departments including civil work, electrical, plumbing and safety. Each of the departments explained their role and execution post the planning of a project and how the division of labor among these departments happens. The session also unveiled the ways in which the coordination among various departments involved leads to a successful completion of the project, giving the real life scenario of the inter-disciplinary learning that the students are involved in school.

Overseas Options

On January 30th 2019, Gen Next Education, Bangalore conducted a session for the students of Classes 10, 11 and 12. It was to provide credible, reliable, comprehensive and timely information on overseas education for the learners, promoting informed decision-making regarding their academic future. It was an informative and interactive workshop wherein students had an opportunity to interact with the University

representatives about admission requirements, scholarships, financial aid, etc. The visiting team had representatives from six deemed Universities in the United States. The focus of this session was to ensure that every student understood the available options starting from program/degree choice, geographical location, size of the University/College, cost of living and tuition, admission

criteria, etc.

Addressing Adolescents

Adolescence is a period of life which brings a lot of physical and behavioral changes. The transition from childhood to adulthood is not just confusing, but challenging too, leading to a lot of stress in the teens. To address the challenges of adolescence, on National Science Day, facilitators of Class 8 biology had organized a session by Dr. Hemapriya, an

Obstetrician, on 28th February, 2019. The session began with a discussion on common biological changes observed in both boys and girls during adolescence. The doctor explained the scientific reasons for the changes happening in our bodies, with a slide presentation. A detailed view of the menstrual cycle was laid out using appropriate videos and presentations.

Children were able to clarify their doubts on myths and taboos related to menstruation practiced in society. Children also posed questions on increasing rate of child obesity, food habits to be followed during adolescence etc., which were answered scientifically. Dr. Hemapriya touched upon the socialization challenges like peer pressure and the ways of handling them, thus providing the students the wisdom with which to negotiate their way through a turbulent phase of life.

Lessons on saving lives

It is most important for an educator to be equipped with life-saving skills because of the precious young lives they are surrounded by, even though everyone hopes not to be in such a situation at all. On 21st March 2019, the teachers and administrative staff of Excel Public School had an opportunity to be addressed and trained by as many as seven doctors and medical staff from different hospitals of Mysore doing service under the organization of Indian Resuscitation Council. Dr. Mahadev, a member of EPS community, a parent and the President of the Indian Society



of Anesthesiologists, Mysuru Branch, addressed the gathering regarding CPR and its significance. He spoke on how to perform a CPR, specifically Compression-Only Life Support (COLS). It was followed by a demonstration and practical experience on CPR training mannequins for every individual in the staff with precise steps. The workshop was empowering and informative to the stakeholders involved. The workshop concluded with the Principal, Mr. Mathew K G, expressing gratitude to the representatives of the medical fraternity and wishing good health to all.

Unsung Heroes

It is not every day that students get an opportunity to interact with those who are tasked to shield the nation from the ugliness out there. On 26th March 2019, a collaboration of the Kannada and Hindi departments gave Class 10 students the opportunity to interact with two doctors who are a part of our nation's armed forces and whose expertise and renown is unparalleled, in an event called "Sandarshana".

Dr. PKM Shenoy and Dr. Kavitha Shenoy's interaction with the students inspired the learners by their courage, valor and willingness to forfeit the comforts that could have come with their degrees from prestigious colleges. They outlined some of the acute problems the world is unfortunately facing, and talked at length about

the role our armed forces and the UN play in safeguarding world peace. They spoke of the limited resources that are available in war-torn zones and areas of conflict, where causalities are a norm, and despite all of which they trudge on, attending to the maladies of our gallant and intrepid servicemen and women, as well as civilians.

They explained how having such physically and mentally demanding jobs could inadvertently put quite some strain on family and relationships, as well as their faith in each other. They also talked of how, many a time, the men and women they were charged with treating kept them going.

Dr Kavitha also made note of how the duo bolstered each other whenever times got tough, and how they undertook numerous challenges together in order to treat ailing servicemen as effectively as possible. After a question-and-answer

session, the students expressed their profound gratitude to the Shenoys and the service they rendered with a song they composed. It was indeed a thought-provoking and stimulating experience, one which we hope will push more
